Introduction- The U.S. Forest Service is an American agency, a part of the Department of Agriculture. The agency administers 155 national forests as well as 20 grasslands of the nation encompassing 780,000 sq km. Some of the agency's major divisions include the Research and Development, Private and State Forestry and National Forest System.



Company History: The founding of the U.S. Forest Service, a part of the Department of Agriculture of the U.S. can be traced back to the end of 19th century. The country's national forests were initially called forest reserves and these began in 1891 when Forest Reserve Act was set. This allowed the nation's president to establish the forest reserves from the public land that was covered with timber. Many early visionaries and leaders and willing presidents, trained professionals, conservation and scientific organizations made it possible to retain acres of forest land.

Even today, professionalism and pride continue to be a part of the U.S. Forest Service. Currently, the country has a system which includes 222 experimental and research forests, 20 grasslands and 155 national forests along with many special areas which cover over 192 million acres of land. U.S. Forest Service is today an agency with 30,000 employees which manages these national forests for several uses such as wildlife, fish, grazing, water, minerals, wilderness, timber and recreation. The agency's history has been remarkable and long. During the last century, it has initiated many innovative procedures and products. It has also led the nation in scientific forestry topics. Over the years the U.S. Forest Service has managed to achieve remarkable results and it continues to evolve over the years.
