The scientists of the organization have pioneered the hydrological techniques for gauging the discharge in streams and rivers as well as modeling the flow in ground water, complex systems. United States Geological Service also trained the astronauts that landed on the moon in the year 1969 in geology. Various innovative ventures of the organization with agencies in the private sector has provided the world today with digital images of communities and neighborhoods and it is the largest data set to be available online today.

The understanding of location and formation of mineral resources and energy deposits is rooted in the fundamental breakthroughs of the scientists of United States Geological Service. The biologists of the organization have revolutionized thinking related to management of wildlife resources. This has provided a strong scientific basis which allows waterfowl conservation as well as recreational hunting to work as adaptive management rather than conflicting interests.
