## Ways to Answer “Tell Me About Yourself” at Interviews

Interviews can be nerve wracking experiences, especially with the easy, yet difficult questions that you have to answer. Getting the answers right isn't the problem. - "When I was young, I wanted to be..." Show the employer that you were always looking forward to this line of work. This beats looking like you just decided to apply for the heck of it.
- "This morning, I Googled myself and found..." If you want to show that you are a cool, tech-savvy person, then this would be the thing to say, especially if you are applying to a company that is young or young at heart.
- "My true passion is..." Let the employer know who you are through what you're most passionate about. This is a great way to unearth who you are, rather than what you do.
- "The people closest to me would say I'm..." Self-awareness is a definite plus to recruiters because it shows that you can self-evaluate and possibly improve your weaknesses.
- "If my life story was made into a Hollywood movie, it would be called..." Use a title that is engaging and interesting.
