Get creative and add some points that will take the reader by surprise. A cover letter is a good way to let the interview know more about your personality. Sales professionals should be friendly, and portraying this in your cover letter portrays you in a better light with a potential employer.

3- Be Original

You can use some cover letter tips from the internet, but it's important to add your own personal touch in order to impress the interviewer. There are a number of people who choose to simply copy and paste a cover letter, and they usually don't get the job, so focus on creating short content that is yours and speaks about you.
